Model exam

- Discussion Volunteers QP come up with a set-up for a model exam
- Exam is divided into 4 parts:
 - Navigation
 - Sailing the craft
 - Security and communication
 - Technology and maintenance
- Possibilities:
 - Examination parts can be written or pre-tested
 - Examination parts can be proved by certificates already obtained

- All examination parts, which can be tested separately, must have been completed on the exam ship prior to the practical examination



Dutch approach

- A practical exam on board of a vessel
- The exam consists of practical and theoretical parts
- Before the practical exam on board of the vessel the candidate must show his or her portfolio.
- The exam consists of 5 sub-tests:
 - Manoeuvring and navigating under supervision
 - Anchoring on command
 - Mooring and unmooring from the deck
 - Preparing the vessel to sail out (Maritime waters)
 - Maintenance, repair and engineering on board Communication and safety are recurring topics in this exam.
- The exam takes place on a training vessel of at least 40 meters in length. The assessor observes the skills and asks a number of questions to test your knowledge.
